We offer the BA (Hons) Education degree as a four-year programme which allows you to start your studies with a foundation year before beginning the main undergraduate degree course and modules above. The first year of study is designed to develop academic skills and confidence required for an undergraduate degree.

EDUCATION AND MATHEMATICS BA (Hons)

This course joins together two vibrant and wide-reaching subject areas into one degree. Education Studies looks to emphasise modern educational issues beyond the confines of the classroom. This is gained through varied modules and work-based placements so you can begin to question and examine contemporary educational issues in modern society.

The mathematical element has been developed to provide you with a core of pure mathematical knowledge. It offers an excellent grounding into advanced theory and mathematical techniques. This course provides the skills and qualities needed for a rewarding career and options to study either education or mathematics at a postgraduate level, or to obtain Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) via a PGCE.

The Education degrees are designed to maximise career opportunities in a diverse range of settings including schools, museums, art galleries, church and faith organisations, prisons, hospitals, charities, or in international development.

To support this emphasis is placed on learning about education in the community with using trips to help you study. On visits you will see how education is an important part of the work of theatres, art galleries and museums. Be prepared to be learning outside of the lecture theatre.

You will also conduct work-based placements in Year Two and Three to help you to contextualise theoretical learning. These placements can be in schools but you will also have the opportunity to complete placement in a wide variety of scenarios, it could be in a nursery, a further education college, a charity or a museum to name a few options. You can even organise to do your placement abroad. You will be able to select a placement that will help you with your future career pathway. The placements enhance your CV and future employability potential.
