### The Academic Award offered is a Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) for:

- Primary Generalists (5-11 years)
- Primary Early Years (3-7 years)
- Secondary – Biology, Chemistry, Dance, English, History, Mathematics, Modern Foreign Languages, Music, Physical Education, Physics

### Programme Details:

- 25 days minimum requirement in university for subject study and professional studies (Sept/Oct, Jan/Feb), 3 academic assignments at Masters level.
- Salaried and Tuition fee places available
- Training programme runs from September – July
- Phased teaching timetable
- Alliance training and professional support
- Second school contrasting placement – 5/6 weeks Feb-Easter

### Additional experience:

- Primary: 5 days EY, 2 days Y7, 1 day SEN
- Primary Early Years: 5 days nursery, 2 days KS1/2, 1 day SEN setting
- Secondary: 5 days KS2, 3 days post-16, 1 day SEN

### Entry requirements:

- GCSE English and Mathematics Grade C/Grade 4 (also Science for Primary)
- Honours degree 2:2 or above
- DBS and health checks
